On the 18th of March 2020, the government of Malaysia has imposed a Movement Control Order (MCO) to minimize and break the chain of the viral spread in our country. The order was supposed to end on the 31st of March 2020, but was extended by the government until the 14th of April 2020. This extension is a necessity to ensure that the Covid-19 infection chain is halted and to flatten the epidemic curve. As a result of this MCO, all premises and businesses are ordered to stop their operations except for essential services. Schools are also affected by this MCO and as such, J&J was required to shut its doors. The teachers at J&J greatly miss the students. During the first week of this MCO, teachers at J&J cleaned up their respective classes and sanitized every area possible. 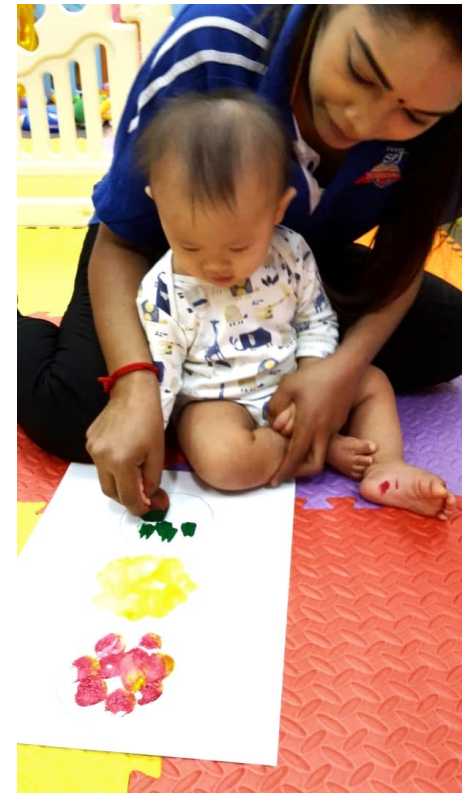
